Lent is an important time in our faith. It invites us to step back from our lives and examine how attached we become to the things of this world. Everything we do during Lent calls us to turn our gaze back toward the heavenly reality.

Lent is a season of fasting and sacrifice. It is good for us to give up something and to offer that struggle as both a reparation for our sins, but also knowing that God uses these sacrifices to help us grow closer to him. The Church calls us to fast on certain days and to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. Here are few things to help us understand what means, and who is required to fast and abstain from meat.

All Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of complete abstinence from meat for all who are 15 years and older.

Veiling of Statues and Icons During Passiontide:

This ancient Catholic practice stems from the former liturgical calendar in which the old Gospel reading for the 5th Sunday of Lent (i.e. the Passiontide) tells us on how Jesus hid himself away from the Jews when they attempted to stone Him.

According to St. Augustine, at this moment when Jesus "hid himself" from the Jews, Christ in fact became invisible by virtue of His Divine nature. To help signify this mystery, crucifixes and images of Christ are veiled with purple cloth on the evening before the start of the Passiontide. The same goes with the images of the saints, as it is befitting that if the glory of the Master is hidden, then His servants should not appear. Furthermore, the veils are hard to miss and serve as a reminder for us to get ready. They build within us a longing for Easter Sunday, when Christ lifts all veils through His Resurrection.



Vocations

Continuing our exploration of the 7 diligent discernment stages to the priesthood, the second stage is The Latency Period. A man in stage 2 has now been thinking about priesthood for some time, usually a few years, depending on when he entered stage 1. He is not thinking about it every day, however. Rather, more days pass when he does not think about it at all. The idea surfaces from time to time, usually at Mass, while praying at night, or when another person mentions it. He has not convinced himself that priesthood is a real possibility. Sometimes a man in stage 2 will prematurely "decide" that he is not being called to priesthood. God has done great things for you. Spread the good news. Consider a church



vocation. (Mark 1:40-45). If you think God is calling you to be a priest, email vocations@archomaha.org.
