

Vocations

This coming Wednesday is the feast of St Joseph the Worker. This day is also celebrated as Religious Brothers Day, a day to celebrate and give thanks for religious brothers in our lives. Many of us are familiar with the Marianists brothers from Gross Catholic. The Marianist order aims to make family spirit the distinctive mark of its communities, imitating Mary's faith, humility, simplicity, and hospitality. Brothers and priests have different roles in the Catholic Church. Unlike priests, brothers do not receive the sacrament of Holy Orders and, therefore, do not have the authority to celebrate the sacraments. Instead, they take vows according to their order and their primary focus lies in living a consecrated life dedicated to prayer, contemplation, and serving others. According to canon law, brothers are neither "lay nor clerical" and are men who feel they are not called to be priests, but instead belong to the religious state of life.
